Analysis of Student Satisfaction Survey: 2020-2021

A Student Satisfaction Survey on overall institutional performance was conducted as per NAAC guidelines for the year 2020-2021. The data was collected on the basis of the questionnaire designed by the NAAC to assess teaching-learning and evaluation of higher education institutes. A random sample of 50 respondents, 22 male and 28 female students, were surveyed upon. This sample unit comprised of 41 students pursuing Bachelors in Arts and 9 students pursuing Bachelors in Science.

According to the survey, 84 % of the respondents positively responded that 85-100 % of the syllabus was covered in class, while 26 % opined that around 70-84 % of the syllabus was covered. In terms of teacher's preparedness for the classes, 56 % of the students responded that the teachers were very thorough and the remaining 44 % expressed that the preparation was satisfactory. As many as 64 % of the students found the teacher's communication skill to be always effective, 26 % found it to be sometimes effective and 10 % shared that it was satisfactory. 46 % students described the teacher's approach to teaching as excellent, 42 % found it to be very good, and another 12 % students described it as good.

In terms of fairness of internal evaluation process, 70% of the respondents viewed the teachers to be always fair and the remaining 30 % shared that they were usually fair. 38 % of the students responded that their performance in assignment's were discussed with them every time, 46 % shared that discussions were usually done and 16 % concluded that the assignments were sometimes discussed upon. 16 % of students stated that the institute regularly took active interest in promoting internship, student exchange and field visit opportunities. 36 % mentioned that such opportunities were often promoted, another 36 % shared that it happened sometimes, while 12 % of students felt that the institute rarely promoted such activities.

With regard to the teaching and mentoring process, 38 % felt that they were significantly facilitated by the process in their cognitive, social and emotional growth, 46 % responded that it helped them very well and 16 % were of the opinion that they were moderately impacted by the teaching and mentoring process. Majority of the respondents (60 %) strongly agreed that the institution provided multiple opportunities to learn and grow and 40 % agreed to the same. Around 54 % of students responded that they were usually informed about the expected competencies, course outcomes and program outcomes. While a minor 8 % stated that they were sometimes informed, 38 % were of the view that such information was provided every time.

The survey showed 48 % of the respondents recording that their mentor did necessary follow-ups of the assigned task every time. Another 48 % responded that such follow-ups were done usually and 2 % each opined that follow-ups were rare or occasional. 34 % students felt that the teacher usually illustrated the concepts through examples and applications. And while 2 % mentioned that illustrations were occasional, 64 % revealed that the concepts were illustrated with examples and applications every time. 54 % of students said that the teachers could reasonably identify their strengths and encourage them by providing the right level of challenges and the remaining 42 % answered that the teachers were fully able to do that. About 48 % students responded that the teacher usually identified their weakness and helped in overcoming them, 6 % were of the view that they were occasionally assisted on the matter, and 40 % mentioned that the teacher was able to do that and helped them every time.

As many as 50 % of the students agreed that the institution made efforts to engage them in monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process. Another 46 % of students strongly agreed to this view. A minimal 4 % however, remained neutral about it. 44 % of respondents cited that the teachers moderately used student centric

methods for enhancing learning experiences. 40 % mentioned that student centric methods were used to a great extent and 12 % responded that the teachers somewhat used such methods.

Almost all the students were very positive that teachers encouraged them to participate in extracurricular activities with 66 % strongly agreeing to this view and 34 % being agreeable to it. 54 % of the students responded that the institute/teachers put in moderate efforts to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills, preparing them for the world of work and the remaining 46 % viewed that the institute/teachers made efforts to a great extent for the same. According to 34 % of the students, about 70-89 % of the teachers used ICT tools such as LCD projectors, multimedia, etc., during the course of teaching, 30 % stated that 50-69 % of teachers made use of ICT tools and 36 % shared that above 90 % teachers made use of the same. 48 % agreed that the overall quality of the teaching-learning process was very good and 52 % concluded that they strongly agreed upon the ideal quality of the overall teaching-learning process.

The respondents also made observations/suggestions to improve the overall teaching-learning experience in the institution. They suggested the need for more extracurricular activities, interactive sessions between students and teachers, and to organise more field trips and career guidance programs.


Conclusion and Action Taken Report

An analysis of the Student Satisfaction Survey shows that the college thrives in areas of teaching and mentoring process, with the faculty being portrayed as having the ability to communicate effectively, encourage class participation and motivate the students, identifying their strengths and weakness and working on them. Improvements need to be made in incorporating more extracurricular activities, field trips and career guidance programs in the curriculum.

The Principal along with the IQAC had a deliberation on all aspects of the feedback received from the students and formulated an action plan to address the weakness and to further boost the strengths of the college. Thereafter, a meeting was convened with the faculty and staff discussing the details of the survey and the course of action to be undertaken. The institute is striving towards student's progression, emphasizing on provision of life skills and soft skills to improve the employability of the students as they pass out of the institution. The mentoring, career guidance and counselling cells are keeping close track of students, catering to their queries and guiding them. Emphasis is also being put in to make the teaching-learning process more student-centric, to encourage teachers to use ICT facilities and to have more discussions and interactive sessions with the students. The COVID-19 pandemic hindered the conduct of extracurricular activities but the institute is hopeful to pick up on those once the virus is contained and things return to normalcy.




2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?








6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?




8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.


9. The institute provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.




12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.


13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.


14. Teachers are able to identify your weakness and help you to overcome them.










