#### Analysis of Student Satisfaction Survey: 2021-2022

As per the NAAC guidelines, a Student Satisfaction Survey was conducted for the year 2021-2022. The data was collected on the basis of the questionnaire designed by NAAC to access teaching-learning and evaluation of higher education institutes. A random sample of 55 respondents, 40 pursuing Bachelors in Arts and 15 pursuing Bachelors in Science was surveyed upon.

According to the survey, 98% of the students positively responded that 85-100% of the syllabus was covered in class and only 2% opined that around 70-84% of the syllabus was covered. In terms of teacher's preparedness for class, 64% respondents expressed that the preparation was satisfactory and the remaining 36% felt that the teachers were very thorough. As many as 56% of the students found the teacher's communication skill to be always effective, 33% felt that it was sometimes effective and 11% shared that it was satisfactory. 55% students described the teacher's approach to teaching as excellent, 31% described it to be very good and 14% felt that it was good.

With regard to fairness in internal evaluation, 62% of the respondents viewed that the teachers were always fair and 38% shared that they were usually fair. 47% of students responded that their performance in assignment's were discussed with them every time, 50% shared that those discussions were usually done and 3% concluded that the assignments were sometimes discussed upon. 5% of students stated that the institute regularly took active interest in promoting internship, student exchange and field visit opportunities. 46% mentioned that such opportunities were often promoted, another 47% shared that it happened sometimes and 2% felt that the institute rarely promoted such activities.

In terms of the teaching and mentoring process, 25.5% felt that they were significantly facilitated by the process in their cognitive, social and emotional growth, 49% responded that it helped them very well and 25.5% opined that they were moderately impacted by the teaching and mentoring process. Majority of the students (60%) agreed that the institution provided multiple opportunities to learn and grow and 35% strongly agreed to the same while some 5% remained neutral in their opinion. Around 58% of students responded that they were usually informed about the course outcomes and program outcomes, 21% stated that they were occasionally informed and another 21% were of the view that such information's were provided every time.

The survey showed 29% of the respondents recording that their mentor did necessary follow-ups of the assigned task every time. Another 44% responded that follow-ups were usually done and 27% opined that the mentors got back to their assigned task sometimes. 40% students felt that the teacher usually illustrated the concepts through examples and illustrations, while 7% mentioned that illustrations were occasional, 53% revealed that the teachers always used examples and illustrations in explaining the concepts. 55% of students said that the teachers could reasonably identify their strengths and encourage them and while 7% felt that teachers could only partially do that, 38% answered that teachers were fully able to encourage them after identifying their strengths. Around 33% students responded that the teacher usually noted their weakness and helped in overcoming them, 27% were of the view that they were occasionally assisted on the matter and 40% mentioned that the teacher helped them every time. About 66% of the students agreed that the institution made efforts to engage them in monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process. Another 27% agreed to this view and 7% remained neutral. 49% of respondents cited that the teachers moderately used student centric methods for enhancing the learning

experience, 29% mentioned that student centric methods were used to a great extend and 22%

responded that the teachers somewhat used such methods.

Almost all the students were positive that teachers encouraged them to participate in extracurricular activities with 44% strongly agreeing to this and 51% being agreeable to it. 60% of the students responded that the institute/teachers put in moderate efforts to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills, preparing them for the world of work, 11% felt that efforts were somewhat made in that direction and 29% agreed that the institute/teachers made efforts to a great extent for the same. According to 9% of students, more than 90% of teachers used ICT tools such as LCD projectors, multimedia, etc., during the course of teaching, 29% stated that 70-89% teachers used ICT tools, 7% shared that about 30-40% of teachers used ICT tools and 55% cited that 50-69% teachers used those tools for teaching them. 55% agreed that the overall quality of the teaching learning process was very good and 45% concluded that they strongly agreed upon the ideal quality of the overall teaching learning process.

The respondents also made observations and suggestions to further improve the overall teaching-learning experience in the institution. They suggested the need for more class interactions and discussions, to organise more extracurricular activities, to have a more cordial and friendly relationship between students and teachers, arrange for career guidance talks and seminars on a regular basis and to connect to students on an individual level so as to


be able to help and encourage them.

The analysis shows that the college thrives in areas of teaching and mentoring, with the faculty being portrayed as having the ability to communicate effectively and illustrate concepts efficiently, encourage class participation, motivate the students, identify their strengths and weakness and help them as much as possible. Efforts need to be made in incorporating more extracurricular activities, field trips, organising career guidance programs and class discussions in the curriculum.






5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.




