Analysis of Student Satisfaction Survey: 2019-2020

A Student Satisfaction Survey on overall institutional performance was conducted as per NAAC guidelines for the year 2019-2020. The data was collected on the basis of the questionnaire designed by the NAAC to access teaching-learning and evaluation of higher education institutes.

A random sample of 66 respondents, 31 male and 35 female students, accounting for 25% of the total enrolment were surveyed upon. This sample unit comprised of 60 students pursuing Bachelors in Arts and 6 students pursuing Bachelors in Science.

According to the survey, 70% of the respondents positively responded that 85-100 % of the syllabus was covered in class; 26 % opined that 70-84 % of the syllabus was covered and only 4% were of the opinion that about 55-69 % of the syllabus was taught in class. In terms of teacher's preparedness for the classes, 50 % of the students responded that the teachers were very thorough, 40 % expressed that the preparation was satisfactory, and 2 % cited indifference.

Almost all the students (96 %) found the teachers' communication skill to be effective, while a miniscule 4 % of students viewed it to be just satisfactory. 48 % students described the teacher's approach to teaching as excellent, 46 % found it to be very good, and another 4% and 3 % students described it as good and fair respectively.

With regard to fairness of internal evaluation process, except for 4 % of students who viewed the teachers as sometimes unfair, the rest of the respondents (96 %) labelled the teachers to be fair in evaluation. 74 % of the students responded that their performance in assignment's were usually discussed with them, 12 % shared that discussions were occasional, and 14 % concluded that the assignments were discussed upon every time. 6 % of students stated that the institute regularly took active interest in promoting internship, student exchange and field visit opportunities. 28 % mentioned that such opportunities were often promoted, 47 % shared that it happened sometimes, while 15 % and 4 % of students felt that the institute rarely or never took interest in promoting those activities.

The students responded positively with regard to the teaching and mentoring process with 55 % sharing that they were very well facilitated by the process in their cognitive, social and emotional growth. 36 % responded that it helped them moderately and 9 % shared that they were significantly impacted by the teaching and mentoring process. 32 % of students strongly agreed that the institution provided multiple opportunities to learn and grow. Another 62 % agreed to the same, and a mere 6 % of the students were neutral to the question. Around 63 % of students agreed that they were usually informed about the expected competencies, course outcomes and program outcomes, and 21 % responded that they were occasionally informed. While a minor 2 % stated that they were rarely informed, 14 % were of the view that such information was provided every time.

The survey showed 41 % of the respondents recording that their mentor did necessary follow-ups of the assigned task. 36 % responded that such follow-ups were done occasionally. 12 % revealed that follow-ups were rare and another 11 % concluded that it was done every time. 56 % students felt that the teacher usually illustrated the concepts through examples and applications. 21 % stated that illustrations were occasional and 23 % revealed that the concepts were 'always illustrated' with examples and applications. 65 % of students said that the teachers could reasonably identify their strengths and encourage them by providing the right level of challenges. While 11 % opined that the teacher did that partially, 24 % answered that the teachers were fully able to do that. As much as 59 % students further responded that the teacher identified their weakness and helped in overcoming them and 20 % opined that they

were occasionally assisted on the matter. Only 6 % were of the view that the teacher rarely identified their weakness and around 15 % mentioned that the teacher was able to do that and helped them every time.

As much as 59 % of the students agreed that the institution made efforts to engage them in monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process. Another 25 % of students strongly agreed to this view. A minimal 2 % however, disagreed to this and 14 % were neutral about it. 66 % of respondents cited that the teachers moderately used student centric methods for enhancing learning experiences. 15 % mentioned that student centric methods were used to a great extent, whereas 4 % responded that there was very little use of such methods.

Majority of the students were very positive that teachers encouraged them to participate in extracurricular activities with 51 % strongly agreeing to this view and another 39 % being agreeable to it. Only 2 % of students disagreed to this. 70 % of the students responded that the institute/teachers put in moderate efforts to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills, preparing them for the world of work. While 3 % stated that there was very little effort, 17 % viewed that the institute/teachers made efforts to a great extend for the same. According to 50 % of the students, about 70-89 % of the teachers used ICT tools such as LCD projectors, multimedia, etc., during the course of teaching. 60 % agreed that the overall quality of the teaching-learning process was very good and 32 % concluded that they strongly agreed upon the ideal quality of the teaching-learning process.

The respondents also made several observations/suggestions to improve the overall teaching-learning experience in the institution. They cited improvements in the library, science laboratory, sports infrastructure, provision of Wi-fi in the campus and the need for more teachers in some departments. The students also suggested the need for more extracurricular activities, interactive sessions between students and teachers, and to organise more field trips and career guidance programs.

Conclusion and Action Taken Report


A detailed analysis of the Student Satisfaction Survey shows that the college thrives in areas of teaching and mentoring process, with the faculty being portrayed as having the ability to communicate effectively, encourage class participation and motivate the students, identifying their strengths and weakness and working on them. Strides of improvement need to be made in incorporating more extracurricular activities, field trips and career guidance programs in the curriculum.

The Principal along with the IQAC had a thorough deliberation on all aspects of the feedback received from the students and formulated an action plan to address the weakness and to further boost the strengths of the college. Thereafter, a meeting was convened with the faculty and staff discussing the details of the survey and the course of action to be undertaken. The institute is striving towards student's progression, emphasizing on provision of life skills and soft skills to improve the employability of the students as they pass out of the institution. The mentoring, career guidance and counselling cells are keeping close track of students, catering to their queries and guiding them. Efforts are already being made for upgradation of the science laboratories and the library. Emphasis is also being put in to make the teaching-learning process more student-centric, to encourage teachers to use ICT facilities and to have more discussions and interactive sessions with the students.



How well did the teachers prepare for the class?



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
3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?


4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as:


5. Fairness of internal evaluation process by the teachers.

6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?



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
7. The institute takes active interest in providing internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.


8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.


9. The institute provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.




11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assignment task to you.


12. The teachers illustrate the concepts trough samples and applications.




14. Teachers are able to identify your weakness and help you to overcome them.





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17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.



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
18. Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.


19. What percent of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projectors, multimedia, etc. while teaching?
