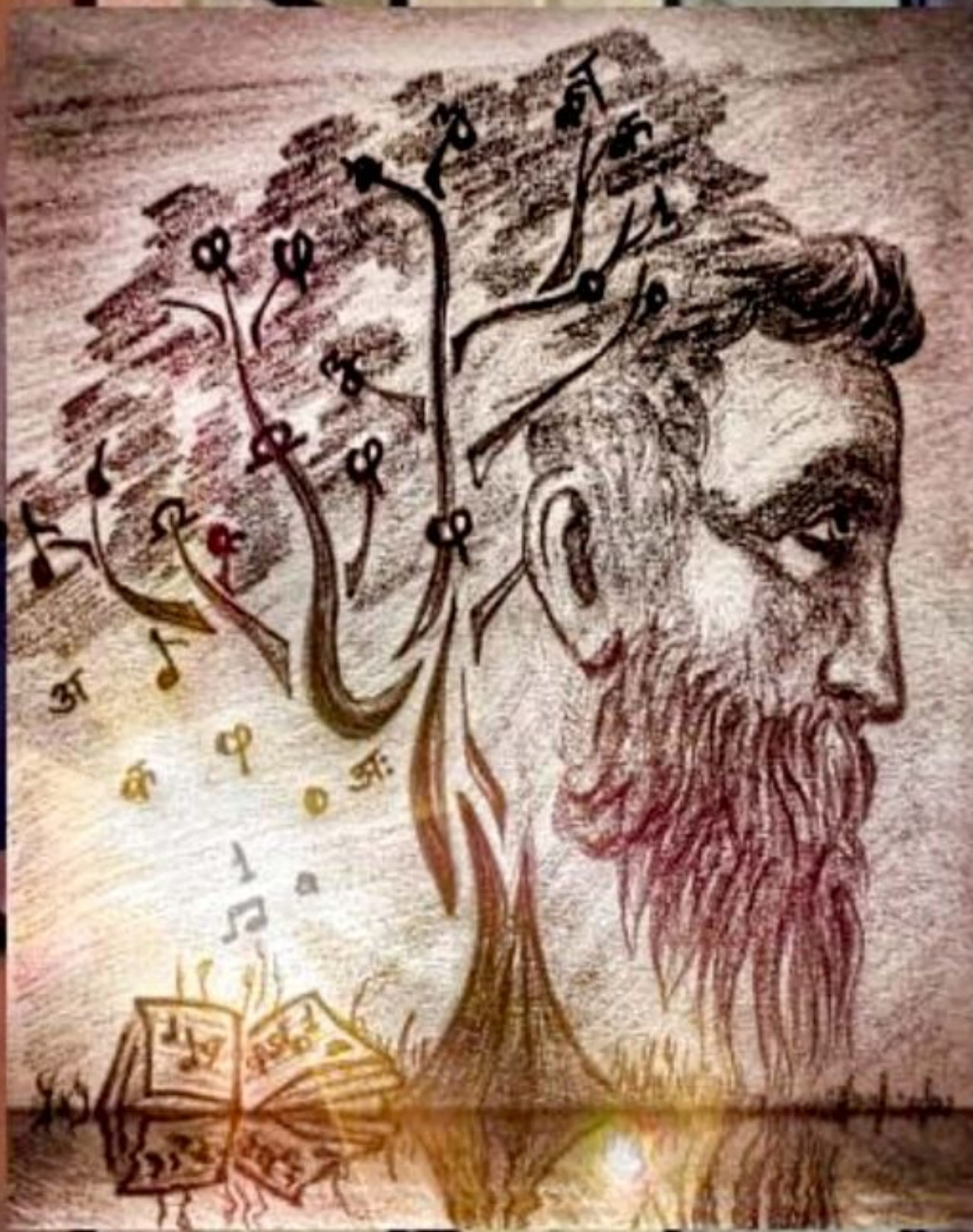

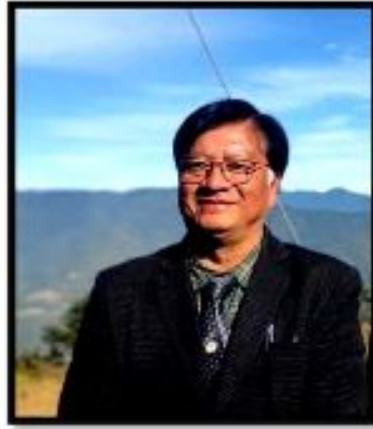


I opened the door to go outside, it was raining cats and dogs. The first thought in my mind was "no not again" but then there's a warm stirring in my heart. I

LEFT, RIGHT OR CENTRE

Having had much deliberation on 'if money could buy happiness?' the usual group of students, those that have endured the system thus far, and were embarked on the ordeal for the receipt of a degree had each a view to defend. While most were of the view that it could, some held on to the notion that it couldn't. Love and peace of mind were essential, they believed, on the path to find true happiness. Food could also make you as 'gay as a lark,' remarked the girls in the front row. They added that guys who could cook would easily make it into their hearts and be the reason for their happiness. All these detours just to make a point that the happiness from having money was but momentary. Thereon, a circumstantial instance was poised: 'As you walk by, give the fellow pedestrian, a random stranger on the sidewalk or the one walking beside you some money and see if it makes them sad or happy.' A brief moment of silence, some muffled giggles, passing remarks in hushed whispers; and soon the entire class was of the opinion that money could buy happiness. It may not be permanent but what is? The elated state of mind from feeling loved or having found peace of mind is just as fleeting and subject to a definitive closure. Their outlook was shaken, wobbly, and this was made less obscure by the verity that towards the end, whatever little belief they held were forgone, either in its entirety or at least a part of it. It is only fair that the mediator reserves his approach for the end, only in this case to find out that the students had taken to his thoughts and cast aside their once upheld convictions they so keenly tried to bolster. Everyone is entitled to their reservations and a certain degree of qualm amidst the biasness is inescapable. Agreeably, demanding total objectivity in the classroom is fallacious and impossible; though it is not unreasonable to demand that the teacher clearly separate judgment and fact, which is not by any means less arduous. A safer way, however, would be for the teacher to flaunt his prejudices and teach without restraint, so that even the naivest of the students would be on guard. Certainly, the partisans would then clash in the free market place of ideas and fight it out until truth finally prevails. The question remains, 'Is this the way to educate students and advance learning?'

A real dilemma confronts every conscious teacher here: "Is there some middle ground that can be advocated between the impossible aloof objectivity and flagrant partisanship?" The answer is indubitably assenting, though not the least austere. Any teacher entrusted with the task of educating the youth should develop that rare trait Gordon Wright dubs 'intellectual integrity,' the willingness to face all facts, even those that may jolt his own deeply held beliefs; vouch against intrusion in the maturity of the uninhibited spirit, enabling all to sway back and forth in their emotions before finally settling for the left, right or centre.

Call of the canteen

When the College Canteen Committee offered me the opportunity to run the college canteen, I was elated. Having managed a restaurant before, I was confident running a canteen will be a piece of cake. But things soon turn sour. For a starter, unlike restaurants, a canteen's staple is the tea, an area where I have very little experience. I had never imagined serving cups of tea would be such a labour and time intensive affair. Let me not even get started on the prices of milk powder and tea leaves. But the worst part of it all, are the choices; if one prefers his cup with a strong tea flavour, the other wants his or hers to be subtle; if someone thinks superfluity of milk powder is the perfect cup of tea, there is always someone to think otherwise. Now I have a fair idea how the phrase "not my cup of tea" originated.

When the news started that we (me and the boys hostel co-warden) will be running the canteen, I was flooded with a torrent of ideas from all quarters. Someone thought it will a grand idea to serve a special dish each day. Convinced, I began serving Momos, Chows, Fried rice, and even burgers. But all I got when I told my customers the day's speciality was, "Itia batt kaiki na ahise ho." The good idea soon had me running around literally forcing my patrons to order the day's speciality, "kai sabi ho, over mitha ase." You won't regret it." But no matter the amount of persuasion, by the end of the day, I was left with plates of unsold meat-based dish which had cost me an arm to cook. In a fit of anger, I tried erasing all the fancy items from the menu list. But the ink of the white board marker with which my friend had, calligraphically, written the menu had solidified and refused to come off the board no matter how hard I tried. So, I left it just as it was only to find to my annoyance people telling me to rub off items that we don't offer from the menu without even knowing half of the story.

Being at the initial phase, we decided to install the water system on a later date. So, I borrowed two twenty litre water bottles from my brother, who runs a mineral water distribution business in Dimapur and converted another two ten kilo milk powder containers into jerry-cans to transport water from my house. One day in a hurry I carelessly loaded the water containers in the back of my vehicle. To my horror, on reaching the canteen I found one of the containers had fallen sideways and all the water had spilled, inundating the floor of my car. It has been months now since the incident but my vehicle still reeks of damp carpet and fungi has started to grow on the floor matting. Now, whenever anyone, especially lady teachers, ask me for a lift, I would hurriedly dash to my car and spray some perfume before they would get into the vehicle to cover up the rotting carpet's smell. One day, one of the passengers developed an allergy to my cheap perfume and had to sneeze the whole way to her house.

Though the initial excitement has fizzled out and things might have gone south a little sooner than I expected, running the college canteen do have its perks. There are rare moments when I effervesce with sheer joy and pride on receiving compliments. And there are those days when things could go the right way without as much as a hiccup. But the best part is when my tea is served in a glass bigger than the normal cups in which I serve my customers. My friends would only look helplessly in utter jealousy and remark, "Malik ase toh na?"

I like to romanticize the canteen as a miniature world in itself; it brings a myriad group of colleagues, students and committees mulling over problems, building strategies, gossiping, or, just having a laugh or two over a cup of tea and a plate of puri-subji. Sometimes I would get animated in the stories they bring to the table; traversing the trails and plot of their narratives and experiencing their joy and sorrows. And there are times I would join them in their tables and script the story. Then there are some who would linger on after their friends have left waiting to join a fresh group that comes along. Some would hurriedly drink their piping hot teas, desperately blowing their cups to cool it with every sip they take and rushing off to their classes. While there are some few who prefers to keep to themselves engrossed in their phones mindless of the chatters and laughter in the room. My humble tea house brings all these different strands of thread together and weave them into a tapestry of 'life in the canteen' that will forever be in my heart to cherish and will be fondly looked back upon when I am old and sitting by the hearth in my rocking chair with my big glass of tea, a smile on my face and the warmth of the fire.
