

3.3.1 - Extension activities are carried out in the neighbourhood community, sensitizing students to social issues, for their holistic development, and impact thereof during the year

Phek Government College undertook a range of extension and student-centric activities aimed at promoting community service, skill development, health awareness, and holistic growth.

1. The Eco and sanitation Club brought out a revised list for the plot allocation for the teachers and the students to continue the Institution Best Practice: *Teacher-Student Synergy for Green Campus* for 2024-2025, and also daily cleaning roster for science and arts block as well as IGNOU centre block were also brought out on the 19th of August assigning students to maintain a litter free campus (toilets and classrooms as well). Containers (tins) and recycled bottles for mugs were painted and distributed in all the students' toilets for water storage and dustbins were also provided in the classrooms in the first week of October 2024.



2. On 5th October 2024 and on 25th October 2024, the Eco and Sanitation club together with the college authority organised two social work in the college campus on account of the upcoming College Fest and with regard to the Mass Social Work across the state of Nagaland respectively.

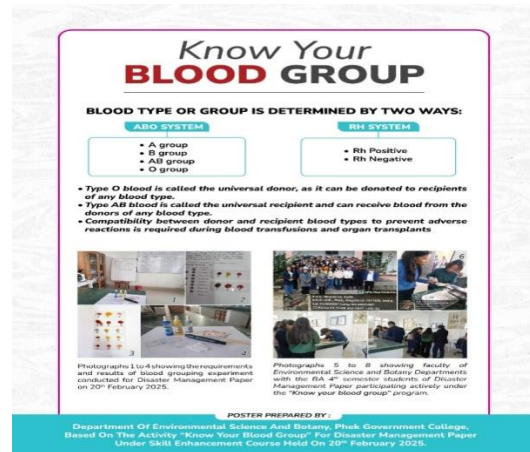

- The first ever College annual fest on the theme 'Therinye' was organized by the Literary, Cultural and Performing Arts from 7th - 8th October 2024.

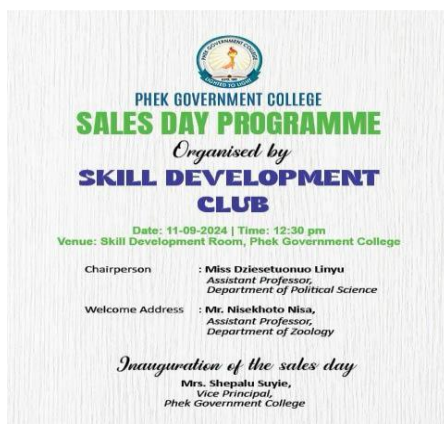

The purpose of the visit was to explore the socio-economic significance and scientific research potential of this indigenous practice. Traditional salt making remains a vital component of the village economy, with the local community continuing to sustain this craft without the use of modern machinery.
